

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE 21, SECTION 9-21.1, ENTITLED "STUDENTS FUNDRAISING; APPROVAL REQUEST; PRINCIPAL TO MAINTAIN LIST" OF THE POLICIES OF THE SUFFOLK CITY SCHOOL BOARD – SECOND READING

BE IT ORDAINED, by the School Board of the City of Suffolk, Virginia that Chapter 9, Article 21, Section 9-21.1, entitled "Students fundraising; approval request; principal to maintain list" of the Policies of the Suffolk City School Board, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 9-21.1. Students fundraising; approval request; principal to maintain list.

— A. Fundraising efforts shall be authorized under conditions that do not conflict with instructional programs. Fundraising refers to the raising of non-appropriated money for the educational benefit of students and their schools.

B. Fundraising shall be permitted by students attending middle and high schools provided such activities are approved in writing and carefully monitored and regulated by the school principal or designee. Elementary school students may not participate in door-to-door solicitation. Students are not excused from class to participate in fundraising activities. No grade is affected by a student's participation, or lack of participation, in a fundraising activity.

C. Each principal shall develop and maintain a list of all fundraising activities pursuant to procedures adopted by the school superintendent. No fundraising shall be approved for any school activity until the activity has been approved. (Adopted February 9, 1995)

Legal Authority - Virginia Code §22.1-78 (1950), as amended.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, subsections, sections and chapters of the School Board's Policy Manual not amended or repealed shall remain in full force and effect.


